

Public Health Risk Management Plans (PHRMP)

The Health (Drinking Water) Amendment Act 2007 requires that all community drinking water supplies with population of greater than 500 develop a Public Health Risk Management Plan (PHRMP) for their drinking water supply.

A PHRMP is a written document that aims to assess and manage risks to the safety of drinking water associated with that drinking water supply. Risks are identified from the water supply catchment right through when the water is supplied to the public.

The PHRMP should aim to identify improvements that are necessary to protect public health.

The PHRMP must be approved by a Drinking Water Assessor.

To help drinking-water suppliers to develop public health risk management plans for their drinking-water supplies, the Ministry of Health has produced a number of tools.
